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About Artis

We are the creative learning specialists.

Our mission is to nurture creativity in every child, everywhere, and shape a thriving society.

Artis is a creative learning charity that enables children to sing, act, and dance their curriculum. This experiential way of learning ensures sparks fly in the right direction! With 4.3 million children in the UK growing up in poverty, impacting their mental health and school attendance, Artis has a profound effect on children's wellbeing by prioritising the arts throughout learning while supporting vital communication skills.

Artis was established in 2004 as a social business to pioneer creative learning in schools and tackle social deprivation, converting to a registered charity in 2017. We bring the expertise of real performing artists into the classroom working with primary-aged children to enhance their ability to learn, challenge and explore through curriculum-based cross-artform practice. We work with primary schools in the top 20% of the most deprived areas in England and we recruit and develop artists to work closely with them and deliver focused learning based on the needs of individual schools. This ranges from lack of engagement to poor literacy or maths skills. Within this framework we also support teachers to develop new management strategies and embed creative learning in their schools.

Since our inception, our practitioners, creative learning specialists have sung about punctuation, acted out fractions and danced the solar system with 775 partner schools across England, with a focus on the urban conurbations of Birmingham, Leeds, London and Manchester, tackling areas of highest deprivation.

Over 277,000 children from across England have participated in Artis programmes that fuse performing arts with curriculum-based learning to enhance educational outcomes, and we have helped sustain the careers of more than 600 creative learning specialists, through employment, training and mentoring.

Our goal is to deliver Artis in partnership with 75 schools in the top 20% of the most deprived areas in England each year, supporting the children and teachers whose lives are most affected by cultural and economic deprivation.

About the role

The School Partnerships Manager will work with the Director and the Programmes Manager to develop a strong and sustainable approach to income generation through school partnerships for Artis. The primary focus will be initiating new partnerships with primary schools, managing a portfolio of ongoing relationships with Artis partner schools, renewal of existing contracts, and contributing to marketing and communications efforts.

Who we are looking for?

- Is a confident and self-driven individual and meticulous planner, with experience of the education sector/and or sales and partnerships.
- Is an effective communicator, who has a warm and friendly manner and positive approach that makes them great at building relationships with schools and partners.
- Can demonstrate a strong understanding of the education sector and is highly motivated to bring high-quality arts and cultural opportunities to children across England.
- Is flexible and solutions-focused, with an adaptable approach to their work and a positive, open approach to collaborating with and supporting others.
- Excellent written and administrative skills with strong attention to detail.
- Is able to confidently and effectively work remotely but also be a team player which is key in our small team.

School Partnerships Manager Job Description

Key Accountabilities:

Partnership and income development:

- Focus on initiating, developing, and maintaining partnerships with primary schools, academies, and trusts.
- Be the first point of contact for schools or organisations interested in Artis' programmes, effectively communicating their benefits.
- Lead on school contract renewals with support from the Programmes Manager.
- Build and manage a network of relationships leading to opportunities for programme and project engagement.
- Use networking opportunities to promote the Artis portfolio.
- Contribute to and stay updated with income generation strategies through school partnerships.
- Achieve annual targets for new business and renewals as agreed with the Director.
- Develop and maintain strong relationships with existing partner schools to ensure ongoing engagement and satisfaction.

Programme delivery:

- Manage a portfolio of Artis partner schools, acting as the main point of contact for queries and ensuring ongoing satisfaction.
- Alongside the Programmes Manager, coordinate emergency and prearranged cover for our creative learning specialists, and support the recruitment of new specialists.
- Evaluation: Liaise with schools and other partners to obtain and collate data and feedback that supports the evaluation of Artis' programme.
- Training: Support year-round live and online training opportunities for the creative learning specialists.
- Co-ordinate distribution of specialist clothing, stickers and certificates.
- Digital: Support the updating of the Artis Hub (online resources) by managing user access and uploading new content.

General responsibilities:

- Stay informed on issues affecting the arts, education and charity sectors.
- Be an exemplary ambassador for Artis, promoting positive relations internally and with partners and schools.
- Maintain accurate records on CRM databases (Salesforce) and ensure internal specialist requests for clothing and stickers are stocked and accurately recorded.
- Have a clear understanding of GDPR and the Data Protection Act and their implications for partnership management.
- Undertake general administrative duties as required.
